AN INSIGHT INTO THE EFFECTS OF WEATHER & CLIMATE

A guest lecture by the Indian Meteorological Society, Dehradun and the Indian Remote Sensing Society, Dehradun was organized by the college. The Speaker was Dr.C M Kishtawal, Group Director, Atmospheric and Ocean Sciences Division at Indian Space Research Organisation. He started the lecture with the main difference between weather and climate and the implications of weather on different parts of history and its role in shaping the world, the way it is today. He quoted examples from history to make his points relatable.

He then moved on to weather forecasting and its impact on many key sectors like agriculture. He then went on to explain about the hydro meteorological hazards like floods, heat waves, droughts etc. Almost a tenth of all these hazards can be prevented with the clever use of advanced weather forecasting. He also explained how most of the notorious tropical cyclones affect the Sunderbans.



His presentation moved on from weather forecasting to Climate forecasting. He said that by 2090 the average temperature in India will increase by more than 5 degrees Celsius and that this will benefit some countries while removing some island countries right off the map. He discussed about global warming and its impact on Arctic Ice.

Heat waves were also the point for discussion. He stressed about the increasing frequency of extreme heat waves. He described Earth as a System of Systems. He stressed on the need to maintain the balance between all systems and explained the ways in which human activities are leading to a lack of balance. He threw light on the efforts made by ISRO and different earth monitoring systems and satellite series. This lecture gave all the listeners an insight into the metrological and climatic aspects of planet earth.



EXPLORING GAMING INDUSTRY

Mr. Rahul Sehgal, founder of UP your game and a mentor, has held positions of Creative Director, Chief of User Experience, Manager UI/UX and Lead Designer. He has been teaching Game Design and Production, and has been mentoring students and student teams since 2010. He's a Creative lead at Ivy comptech (subsidiary of entain group) [world's biggest online platform for real money, usually casino games] and a Design consultant for Hitwicket. He has his own company now, called Roach interactive, Up your game is a part of it.



He was invited by the college to throw some light on the gaming industry and the prospective career opportunities in it. His main skill is game design. Game design involves implementing the ideas the designer or the company comes up with, into a game.

He also shared with us a few interesting aspects about the industry.

In India we are technically the first generation in the families who are playing video games. To get into the gaming industry we'll need a specific set of skills more than a degree. The only and the best way to learn making video games is to actually make them. All one needs is a little interest and a computer. There are many platforms where we can develop our own games and the most famous ones being Unreal Engine, Unity, Game maker, Construct .If you go to a game studio, you wouldn't even need a resume, you can just show the game you've made on your phone. Experience is the Key.





A Game designer's main responsibility is to have a vision on how the game is supposed to look even before the game is made. The game team usually has many people with different responsibilities: Game Design (Define the game play, Write documentation,

Write the story/narrative, Create the game world,

Player psychology), Game Art (The look of the game,

Character design, Game world/environment, Animation and SFX, Lighting and shading), Programming(Implement functionality, Integrate art assets, Integrate sounds and music, Fix bugs) and so on.


Then the most important question was answered - *Is programming required to do game designing?*

No. It is not required. Interestingly, he gave his own example. He said, he hasn't written a single line of code in his past 12 years of game development experience, as only the programming role, of the game development process requires coding.

BUDGET ANALYSIS

Dr. V.V. Sastry, Economics faculty conducted a budget analysis webinar after the union budget 2021-2022. Dr. Sastry started with an introduction on the Minister of Finance of India, Nirmala Sitaraman. She also looks after the corporate affairs of India. She, in her budget 2021 speech announced a slew of taxation reforms along with an increased expenditure on healthcare with Rs 35,000 crore on Covid-19 vaccine development.

What does budget analysis mean?

It explains and examines the components of budget expenditure and revenue. The use of budget ratios can help improve an understanding of issues such as the level of implementation of expenditure and revenue budgets.

- Significant changes to the taxation process.
- → India's fiscal is set to jump 9.5% of GDP in 20-21 as per revised estimates.
- → Rs 2 lakh crore on healthcare services with 35,000 crore on covid vaccine development and inoculation.

HOW DOES THE COVID- 19 VACCINE WORK IN THE BODY?

Covid-19 vaccine helps our bodies develop immunity to the virus that causes Covid-19 without us having to get the illness. Different types of vaccines work in different ways to offer protection. But with all types of vaccines, the body is left with a supply of "memory" T-lymphocytes as well as B-lymphocytes that will remember how to fight that virus in the future.

It typically takes a few weeks after vaccination for the body to produce T-lymphocytes and B-lymphocytes. Therefore, it is possible that a person could be infected with the virus that causes Covid-19 just before or just after vaccination and then get sick because the vaccine did not have enough time to provide protection.

Sometimes after vaccination, the process of building immunity can cause symptoms such as fever. These symptoms are normal and are signs that the body is building immunity.

The Bottom line

Getting vaccinated is one of the many steps you can take to protect yourself and others from Covid-19. Protection from Covid-19 is critically important because for some people, Covid-19 can cause severe illness or death.






HELIUM GAS(He)

Hydrogen Gas (H2)




- Take a thick pet bottle and add Caustic Soda. Tear up pieces of aluminum foil and put them into a bottle. Do not use a container with a lid or cap, as this could result in an explosion. There is no need to measure the amount of aluminum and caustic soda(NaOH)used. Wear gloves for safety before touching them. Its high concentration can cause severe burns or irritate the eyes, skin, etc.
- Place a balloon on top of the bottle or container neck. Then you notice the reaction begins and hydrogen gas forming in the bottle and it begins to expand the balloon. Now rotate the balloon and remove it from the bottle. And now take it to soapy water and dip the mouth of the balloon in soapy water. You can see the bubbles formed by hydrogen gas reacting with soapy water. Take a burning stick and put it near the bubble you can hear a POP sound.
