HIM/HER


Every person has a DREAM PERSONALITY. Let it be a fictional character or a

UNSUNG HEROES – Magdalena Carmen Frida Kahlo Calderón

"Every success story is a tale of constant adaptation, revision and change"

Yes, she was diagnosed with polio when she was six, her right leg was thinner than her left leg, she had a unibrow and moustache! Yes, she had gone through a devastating trolley accident, where she broke her bones and had thirty operations. She had gone through depression, and yet she says- "Feet, what do I need you for when I have wings to fly?" Yes, this is Frida Kahlo.

Magdalena Carmen Frida Kahlo Calderón was born on 6 July 1907, México. Kahlo enjoyed art from an early age, although she did not consider art as a career. She always wanted to become a doctor. When she was roughly eighteen years old, a hazardous bus accident in 1925 left Kahlo in lifelong pain. The illness also forced her to be isolated from her peers. She rarely cracked a smile and lived dying. Confined to bed for three months following the accident, Kahlo began to paint. Painting became a way for Kahlo to explore questions of identity and existence. She explained, "I paint myself because I am often alone and I am the subject I know the best." Her father always encouraged her. He also taught her photography, and she



began to help him retouch, develop, and colour photographs. Kahlo derived more inspiration from Mexican folk art, drawn to its elements of "fantasy, naivety, and fascination with violence and death". The Mexican artist's myriad faces, stranger-than-fiction biography, and powerful paintings come to vivid life in a new film.

She remains the queen of self-portraits. Life experience is a common theme in Kahlo's approximately 200 paintings, sketches, and drawings. Now each of her paintings costs between \$8 million-\$15 million. Earth has lost one of its greatest painters on 13 July 1954. Frida Kahlo died of a pulmonary embolism at the age of 47. "I hope the leaving is joyful, and I hope never to return", she said.

SCIENCE IS A DOUBLE-EDGED SWORD

We all know how the big bang created everything in the universe in opposites. Symmetry, perfect balance. These apply to the matter as well, if there's matter, then there should be antimatter as well.


The world's largest scientific research facility- Switzerland's Conseil Européen pour la Recherche Nucléaire (CERN) has succeeded in producing the first particles of antimatter. For example, the electron which is said to be negatively charged, there should be a corresponding particle that should be identical in every way but with a positive electric charge. And this particle is known as a positron.

It is the most powerful energy source known to man. It releases energy with

100% efficiency. Just so you know, nuclear fission is only 1.5% efficient. And the best part about the antimatter is that it creates absolutely no pollution nor does it emit any sort of radiation. A droplet of this antimatter could power the entire city of Hyderabad for a full day.




'A House Without Windows' is a beautifully written novel and a must read.

TRAVELOGUE

In 2008 the unimaginable happened. I had never once imagined what lay ahead of me after I was done for good or I thought so with my higher education. It so happened that one morning I found myself aboard a domestic flight from Hyderabad to Mumbai. This was the first time I was going out of undivided A.P. This was the first time I even went to Mumbai. It was a sultry day and once outside the Mumbai airport, I was in the cab and watching the high rises. I went for my visa appointment and viola! I got my Schengen visa and the officer wished me good luck.

A few days later we went from Hyderabad to Dubai and Dubai to Nice. Nice is a beautiful town in the south of France. I had never been on a long flight journey before and they upgraded my seat to first class or something I don't really remember. The thing I remember vividly was my flight gliding down the blue Mediterranean waters. Once my flight landed at the Nice de ville airport, I was in another continent, Europe!

Here I was in the most sophisticated of places. I was naïve, totally unprepared and not knowing absolutely anything. I didn't quite realise this was where Rousseau belonged. Rousseau, the great French philosopher! This was the land where the people would know a foreign language(English)but will only converse in French. I was in France and it took me sometime to realise where I was. It was the time Nicholas Sarkozy just got elected as President of the French Republic. Sadly it was the same time in India the former CM of AP Late YS Rajasekhara Reddy died in a plane crash.

Once in France, I was introduced to the French culture, food, fashion and language and football. In France usually the breakfast served is croissant, coffee or fresh orange juice. 




